Rep. Jack helps repeal ban of tankless water heaters

Regulation affected Rinnai America Corporation's manufacturing facility in Griffin

WASHINGTON, DC — Congressman Brian Jack (R-Ga.) helped lead a bipartisan majority Feb. 27 to pass

H.J. Res. 20, a joint resolution that repeals a regulation imposed during the Biden Administration that would ban non-condensing tankless water heaters manufactured

manufactured in Griffin at Rinnai America Corporation's manufacturing facility, which employs over 300 workers.

The bipartisan vote in the House of Representatives was 221-198. 210 Republicans and 11 Democrats voted for the legislation, introduced by Rep. Gary Palmer, (R-Ala.) and heavily promoted by Rep. Jack.
