Expected to open in 2017, Dollar General will create 535 jobs at the underconstruction, 1,000,000 square foot, \$85,000,000 facility along the Interstate 75 corridor in both Butts and Spalding counties.

"The Dollar General project represents a significant and positive step forward for the economy of our region," said Bryan Bush, chairman of the Joint Development Authority of Butts County and Spalding County. "We thank the Georgia Economic Developers Association for recognizing the impact that collaboration and teamwork can have on our community."

JDA member and Griffin-Spalding Development Authority Chairman Chuck Copeland said "it is certainly an honor to receive statewide recognition for this project. The two economic development professionals from our respective counties, David Luckie of Griffin-Spalding and Laura Sistrunk of the Butts County IDA, certainly did the heavy lifting on securing this project."

Copeland said, "while the level of cooperation between the two county governments helped keep the project moving forward, the most exciting aspect of the project will be the addition of some 500 new jobs to our community."

The new JDA was formed to accommodate

the project in order for the development authorities of both counties to work together on this one project that sits on the border of both counties on Jackson Road. The JDA required extraordinary cooperation of both county commissions as well, with intergovermental agreements signed to help facilitate the project and the creation of the JDA.

The JDA includes four members from each county, with Copeland, Luckie, Tom Gardner and David Parker from Griffin-Spalding Development Authority, and Bush, Sistrunk, Bart White and Alicia Washington from Butts County
